You can even initiate the start of a matching fund where you supply the funds that will be matched for a future matching challenge.

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The holidays offer a rare opportunity to get the whole family together and it's the perfect time to get your kids and grandkids involved in giving. One idea is to host group activities that help them engage with and think about the wellbeing of others. Start by creating a real (or even hypothetical) 'budget' that needs to be given away. KNOW YOUR MINIMUMS

If you have a charitable vehicle with a minimum distribution requirement, make sure you know what it is and how much you have left to disburse so your assets are used for charitable purposes and not penalties. For example, private foundations are required to annually distribute at least 5% of the previous year's average net assets. Qualifying distributions from the foundation include grants to public charities, administrative expenses and certain costs related to carrying out the foundation's charitable purpose, such as a building, computers, and office furniture.
